

FAQs

Q. What is the Reciprocal Agreement? How can I visit another club?

A. Member Clubs of the Association recognize and honor a reciprocal agreement which allows individual members of a Club to visit any of the other Clubs within the Association. The reciprocal agreement encourages fellowship among the various universities and enhances the lines of communication between the associated Clubs and their individual members.

~ Reciprocal Membership Card & Brochure ~

Any member in good standing of an individual Club may visit other Clubs that belong to the Association. The [ACUC Reciprocal Membership Card](#) may be issued by each Club to members in good standing, along with a brochure listing the participating Clubs. Cards and brochures may be obtained by contacting the Association Headquarters.

~ Visiting Other Clubs ~

Each Club in the Association is a unique reflection of the university community it serves. The facilities and services available, as well as hours of operation, are quite different in each Club. To insure an enjoyable visit to another Club, it is important to telephone ahead whenever possible to find out when the Club is open, and what services are offered to a visiting member. Often the Manager of a Club can assist members in arranging a visit to another Club by calling in advance.

Individual Clubs may have restrictions in the use of their facilities, or in the frequency of visits, which should be respected. Find individual clubs by location in the [CLUB RECIPROCITY](#) section of this website. Please check with the individual club regarding dining hours or services available to visiting members with reciprocal privileges.

Q. How do I get a new ACUC Roster?

Q. How do I order more ACUC membership cards or Reciprocal Program brochures?

A. One of the primary benefits of Association membership is the Reciprocal Program. Member clubs agree to extend dining privileges to individual members of other ACUC clubs.

The Association provides an initial supply of cards and brochures to each new member club. Clubs may order additional cards and brochures at nominal cost by downloading the an [order form](#). To order cards and brochures, mail your order with check or fax with a credit card number to ACUC Headquarters. Individual members should contact their home club to obtain a membership card.

Q. Can my club members call ACUC for information about other ACUC clubs?

A. Since we have no way of verifying membership in your club, we have no way to know whether such a caller is entitled to reciprocal privileges or not. Plus, we want to keep ACUC dues affordable, and staffing up to handle dozens of these kinds of calls each month would be quite expensive.

This information is available to your members through this website. We suggest you publish an informational letter or article in your club newsletter directing members to visit the ACUC website, and simply click the link to "Reciprocal Clubs." The listing contains links to information on each club.

Q. Do you have information about creating a club at my University?

A. ACUC offers an Associate Membership to universities exploring club development. As an Associate Member, you will have access to survey data that will be valuable in exploring club development. Attending the annual conference provides the opportunity to learn a great deal about club development from the educational programs, as well as the other representatives at conference. A number of experienced managers and club representatives are also available to consult with your committee, as are several nationally recognized consulting firms specializing in club marketing and development. Q. How Can ACUC Help You Establish A Club?

A. When you have decided to explore the feasibility of establishing a campus-based club at your institution, membership in the Association of College and University Clubs can be of great help in providing general information and sources of technical assistance.

Whether your club is to be a faculty, faculty/staff, alumni or general membership club, ACUC can put you in touch with other clubs which are similarly constituted. Information on bylaws, facilities, hours of operation, activities, and staffing can be provided by others who have already faced the challenges of campus club management.

In addition, participation by your committee in the Association's annual conferences will provide insight into the workings of campus-based clubs, with tips on how to make your club successful from the start.

For maximum benefit, join ACUC as early as possible as you begin developing plans for your university club.

Q. Can I pay for my dues, conference registration and supplies order via credit card?

A. Yes, you may use your American Express, MasterCard or VISA. For your convenience, we recommend that our international members handle all of their payment transactions this way. All fund received must be in US dollars.
